

# The Legend of Zelda: Symphony of the Goddesses 2017 Singapore Tour Date Announced

**SINGAPORE – May 8, 2017** – Jason Michael Paul Entertainment, Inc. today announced a new 2017 tour date for The Legend of Zelda: Symphony of the Goddesses in Singapore at the Mastercard Theatres at Marina Bay Sands. “We’re really going all-out this year to celebrate the newly released *The Legend of Zelda: Breath of the Wild*,” said Jason Michael Paul, President of Jason Michael Paul Entertainment, Inc., the company producing the concert tour. “Besides all the new stuff, we’re also bringing back the Ballad of the Wind Fish from the original program, which has been a big request from fans for a while.”

Celebrating 30 years of stirring virtual adventure and memorable soundtracks with live orchestral renditions with oversight and approval from the game’s developers and composers, The Symphony of the Goddesses is now in its fourth season. Throughout the evening, a video collage syncs up with the adventurous tunes to spotlight exciting moments from the venerable franchise.
